Dear Friends,

Chaplaincy is a fascinating career. It is interesting to reflect on its history and its place within society today. The word “chaplain” comes from the Latin word for a cloak and its meaning grew from the story of St. Martin who met a man sitting in the rain begging without a cloak. If St Martin had given the man his own cloak he would simply have shifted the problem and become cold and wet himself. Instead, he tore his cloak in two, gave half to the beggar and kept half for himself. Chaplaincy therefore, is a ministry of recognising the needs of another, sharing and being alongside them through the storms and celebrations of their lives.

When the NHS was established in 1948 it was agreed that the needs of the whole person should be considered, consequently chaplains were appointed to care for the spiritual needs of patients their families and staff within the hospital environment. Originally all Chaplain’s posts went to Church of England ministers in respect of the close connection between church and state. However, NHS Chaplaincy provision now reflects more fully the faith and spiritual needs of the hospital community. In fact, Chaplains of all faiths are now employed to minister to patients of any or no faith, the understanding being that our work is very much to care and comfort rather than to convert.

The presence of NHS funded Chaplains in hospitals acknowledges the impact illness or injury can have on our well-being. It is often a time to re-consider our values and relationships and look both within and beyond ourselves for sources of hope, meaning and comfort. Chaplaincy departments exist to meet the needs of patients, their loved ones and all the staff who work within the hospital departments.

In addition to hospitals, Chaplains are found everywhere! You will find us in schools and universities, emergency services, prisons and law courts, shops, ports, the armed forces, even theatres and casinos. Recent research has shown that you are more likely to meet a Chaplain than any other formal religious figure as you go about your daily life. Although traditional Church attendance fluctuates, perhaps we have never had such a great an opportunity to find support and discuss our beliefs as we make our daily journey through life. Chaplains are skilled not only in the ministry of their denomination but also in accompanying those of any or no faith in all the challenges and celebrations of this life.

Norfolk Safeguarding Adults Week 2016 12 - 18 September

The aim of this week is raise public awareness in Norfolk of adult abuse and inform the public of how to identify and report abuse. The key messages we want to get across are:

- Norfolk is a place that does not tolerate abuse
- Safeguarding adults and reporting abuse is everyone's responsibility
- Raising awareness of abuse helps to prevent abuse
- If you or someone you know is being abused then we can help.

In Norfolk, 2,709 safeguarding adult concerns were raised between April 2015 and March 2016. In England there are over 100,000 cases reported of adults being abused each year. Most often the abuse is carried out by someone known to the person who is being harmed.

In our local community, we probably know someone who needs help with their money, to pay their bills or for shopping, or support to get around or carry out daily tasks. Often there is a formal or informal arrangement in place with social services, a care home, carer, friend or relative. Sometimes, though, things may go wrong. The person needing support may feel uncomfortable, afraid or hurt in the situation, or find their money or possessions are being taken from them.

Adults can suffer from all sorts of abuse. As well as physical, emotional and sexual abuse, people can experience financial abuse – when people take money or belongings without asking. People can be neglected, when people who are there to

help do not look after people properly, or neglect themselves to such an extent that this puts them at risk.

The individual causing the harm may be a stranger, but as the statistics show, more often than not it is someone they know and usually feel safe with, often in a position of trust and power, such as a health or care professional, a family member or relative or neighbour.

But everyone has a right to feel safe, to make their own decisions and to be respected and listened to, and live free from abuse or neglect.

So look out for the signs of abuse. These can include someone who looks dirty, is not dressed properly or has an injury that is difficult to explain. Other signs can include someone who seems frightened around certain people, seems unusually down or withdrawn or who finds money missing

Trust your instinct – if something doesn't feel right, it probably isn't. Even if you're not sure whether these signs mean abuse, you should still report them to Norfolk Social Services. You can report your concern anonymously, but please give us as much information as possible so that we can follow it up.
