Dear Friends,

Eleven years ago Helen and I went for a long weekend in Canada. There's a limit to what you can realistically do in such a vast country within a short time, but after climbing the CN Tower in Toronto, our next objective was to buy a copy of The Book of Alternative Services, used by Canada's Anglican Churches. It was a newer and in many ways superior collection of worship to the books in use over here at that time. We thought we'd find it in a city the size of Toronto, but a visit to a large and serious-looking bookshop made us realise this wasn't going to be easy. The Anglican Church of Canada occupies a very different position to the Church of England. It's one of many small denominations, and the bookseller hadn't heard of this book. Helpfully, he suggested we try the Anglican Cathedral, but this was miles out of our way and time was pressing.

Later that evening, our train arrived in Smiths Falls near Ottawa, where our host, a former Merseyside special constable, set about helping us to complete our book challenge. The following day he drove us for many miles to Holy Trinity Anglican Church in the village of Lombardy. The Churchwarden, a retired artillery officer whose father had been a German Lutheran pastor in the Prairies, responded with characteristic Canadian generosity, presenting us with a copy. Later, I found the book had already been presented. Looking inside the cover I read a bookplate commemorating its gift to Holy Trinity by Jean and Ernie Longpre. As we travelled back with our booty, I hoped that Jean and Ernie would approve.

A few months later, we went into Church House Bookshop in Westminster on a day out in London. Near the door was a pile of these Canadian service books, on sale to the public. The penny dropped. I realised how one can travel the world searching for something, only to find it waiting by your front door, where it was all the time. So it is with God.

We may seek God in Lourdes or Compostella or Rome or the Holy Land, but whether we stay or go, he is still less than a heartbeat away from each of us. From the 1960s onwards, young westerners followed the hippy trail to India and the Far East, in search of spiritual enlightenment, without realising it was there for the taking in Slough, Sidcup, South Walsham, indeed anywhere on God's earth. He's just waiting for us to turn up in the right frame of mind.

1600 years ago, St. Augustine made this startling discovery as a young, ambitious professor in Milan. He had reached this pinnacle at the age of 29, but had never felt more miserable. To his surprise, he found that all the time he had been searching for God, God had never left him. Augustine exhorted his contemporaries to 'Come back to your heart. In your inner self Christ has made his home. In your inner self you will be renewed in God's image. And in his image you will recognise your creator.' Much more recently, the folk group Mumford and Sons' debut album echoes these words in their lyrics;

Awake, my soul
awake, my soul

for you were made to meet your Maker.

I hope that whatever this summer may bring, you may find time and space to be still and open to what lies within your heart.
