## The Curate writes,

Three years ago I was ordained to the post of Ordained Local minister in the Broadside group of parishes. It has been a huge privilege to minister alongside Nick and serve as a Curate. This has involved leading and preaching at services each week, conducting services of baptism, marriage and also the privilege of supporting the bereaved in preparing and leading funeral services. I have also continued to minister to children and families through Fairhaven Primary School and our monthly Sunday Plus activities.

Alongside this I have continued working as a Specialist Palliative Care Nurse based at Priscilla Bacon Lodge, covering the GP practices in a large area of north Norfolk in providing symptom management and psychological support.

Since my ordination I have had a sense of God's calling to a professional ministry and this has inevitably led me to explore the balance of my work life and the inevitability that I would need to cease nursing in order to pursue a full time career in ministry.

I began my nurse training in 1986, so the decision to leave this career and follow in a new direction has proved a challenging and testing time. I am absolutely delighted to report that in July of this year I was interviewed and successfully appointed to the position of Chaplain serving Priscilla Bacon Lodge and several other Community Hospitals. As this is a part-time post I am able to work in this role and continue my ministry alongside Nick in the Broadside Benefice.

The process of my appointment and various factors around the timing of the advertisement and interview have demonstrated to me the power and presence of God, who has been very faithful to me in this time of searching and transition.

I am really looking forward to starting my new role ministering to patients and staff within a range of health care environments whilst continuing my ministry amongst the people of these villages, but with the integrity of being a full-time minister.

On October 6<sup>th</sup> I commence this new role and on the 15<sup>th</sup> at 3pm I will be licensed by Bishop Jonathan to this new ministry. I appreciate your prayers as our family prepares for this new step.

My journey has been long and complex, at times the hurdles have felt too high and the way too narrow yet despite years of searching God has, as ever, demonstrated him (or her) self to be more powerful and present than we ever fully acknowledge.

My encouragement to each one of you is to stay faithful, set your heart on your goal and patiently listen and follow the one who forever calls and sustains us.

## FAIRHAVEN C OF E VA PRIMARY SCHOOL NEWS

What a busy end of term it has been. We sent a team of children to the Acle Cluster Sports competition which was held at the UEA. The children were incredibly enthusiastic thriving on the opportunity to use the excellent facilities. All the children supported each other extremely well and put in 100% effort when competing. They won numerous gold, silver and bronze medals, achieving 2nd place overall! The same week we took part in the Cluster swimming gala, eight children took part in eight races, in total they won four gold medals, one silver and one bronze medal highlighting their brilliant performances.

Both our Year 5's and Year 6 children have undertaken cycling proficiency training. The Year 5 training took place on the school playground whilst the Year 6's cycled around the village, learning how to be aware of traffic, how to signal and turn correctly. We are pleased to say that all of the children who undertook the training passed the test.

On 16th July we have our annual Sports Day decathlon. The sun shone and everyone was smiling. Lots of parents came along to support the children and were very encouraging which helped to create a lovely atmosphere. The overall winners this year were the Yellow team. When this was announced, they received a sportsman like cheer from all their opponents. Sports Day was followed by a special picnic lunch which the parents joined in with.

For our school trip this year we took advantage of Fairhaven Gardens' hospitality. They kindly arranged lots of different activities for the children to take part in. They had a trip on a boat, made dens, decorated clay pots and made bug homes. The children (and staff) had a wonderful day.

The very end of term saw our musicians putting on a short concert to show what they have been learning. We even had some of Class 3 playing the ukuleles that they have been learning this year courtesy of a grant from The Ranworth Trust. Class 4 put on a production of Joseph as part of the leavers assembly and Classes 1 & 2 showed off their acting skills with "A trip around the World". ### Ranworth Rood Screen Appeal

On 17<sup>th</sup> September 2013 the PCC received a grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund for a total of £155,000 that represents 76% of the total project costs of £203,766. This is a key date as within one month's time [17<sup>th</sup> September 2014] it is necessary to prove to the HLF that the project can be financed as a whole.

As of 15<sup>th</sup> August 2014 the total funds raised stands at £194,450. This leaves a shortfall of £9,316. There is one more major fund raising event covering 11<sup>th</sup> – 14<sup>th</sup> September and there are current grant applications to trusts and charities that await a decision. There are also facilities available for taking out a bridging loan to cover any temporary shortfall. In all events the Ranworth Rood Screen Project will go ahead as planned.

To date the development stage is all but complete. This stage incorporates the investigative work and monitoring prior to the start of the delivery stage that is the main body of the project, dealing with the re-leading of the nave roof, repair of the rainwater disposal systems and upgrading of the overall drainage. This will take place during the winter of 2014/15 and be completed by the following summer.

Over the days of 11<sup>th</sup> – 14<sup>th</sup> September I will be around to answer any questions and discuss all aspects of the project and accompanying reports. In the meantime my thanks to everyone for the continued drive and enthusiasm that has underpinned this entire project, it has been truly amazing.
